

Shepherded and Shepherding

Although it has become a wedding and party venue, there used to be a sheep farm between Glencoe and Silver Lake. I am not sure if I would feel completely comfortable eating a wedding feast where sheep used



to eat and sleep, but that is beside the point. Shooing the squirrels away. Most times as I drove between parishes I would see the sheep grazing in the pasture. They would be scattered here and there tending to their own needs and desires. They were calm and placid as I drove by, and on some summer days I would think that they almost looked like a painting. On other occasions I would see someone standing by the sheep shed waiting, and the sheep would be walking towards him or her in one long orderly line. Not one

of the sheep seemed to be anxious to pass another, they would be lined up head-to-tail making their way from the pasture to the shed. Since I was driving at 55 miles per hour I couldn't tell if the person by the shed was calling them, or if the sheep just knew that he or she was the signal that it was time to leave the pasture for the shed. The person in charge of the sheep leaned patiently against a post waiting for the sheep to make their way home.

Today we celebrate "Good Shepherd Sunday." Jesus reminds us that he is our shepherd. He guides, feeds and protects us on our journey through life. He does this willingly and out of love for us. As he reminds us, the Father has sent him to lay down his life for us, his flock. He empties himself willingly and joyfully so that we can be filled with life and joy. We are his flock and he is our shepherd. Like the sheep that I observed on my many trips back and forth from Glencoe to Silver Lake, he guides us to green pastures to be nourished, and patiently calls us to his side when it is time. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, is a reflection of God's desire to love us and care for us. As St. John Paul II said, "We are made out of love and for love." Jesus reveals that God's plan for our lives is to experience his love through his gentle care.

I have loved being your shepherd, and nothing has given me greater joy than serving you, loving you and walking with you in Jesus' name. However, in the last week it has become obvious that I can no longer meet all the demands of being your pastor. My end of life journey has become more difficult, and while my spirit is willing, my body is giving way to a not so gradual decline. My strength, balance, appetite, pain and weakness are noticeably more difficult. I will continue to guide the administration of our parishes, by asking other priests to represent my opinion and desires for our ministry. Most importantly, I am choosing to dedicate these last weeks of my life to prayer, celebration of the liturgy and preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ. I will work as much as I can, and I hope to serve you faithfully until the Lord calls me home.

I watch for the shepherd leaning on the post of sheepfold gently encouraging me on my journey home, and I pray that I might be a gentle, loving, faithful and courageous pastor for those who follow me.
